North America

- <u>The Mississippi River</u> the length is 3 370 km
- <u>The Colorado River</u> creates Grand Canon (446 km)
- <u>St. Lawrence River</u>

South America

- <u>The Amazon river</u> the longest river in the world (6 992 km)
- <u>The Orinoco River</u> is located in Venezuela and Colombia

North America The Niagara Falls

The Niagara Falls is a collective name for a total of three adjacent waterfalls on the Niagara River, which flows from Lake Erie and flows into Lake Ontario. The largest and most famous of them, Horseshoe Falls, reaches a height of 52 meters

South America

The Angel Waterfall

Is the highest waterfall in the world (979 m).



Strait

The Bering Strait

is a naturel strait between the Asian and American continents, one of the world's major straits. It connects the Pacific Ocean with the Arctic Ocean, specifically the Bering and Chukchi Seas. It is 82 kilometers wide, and the maximum depth is 52 meters.





Panama Canal

Panama Canal waterway in Panama that connects the Atlantic Ocean with the Pacific ocean. Canal locks at each end lift ships up to Gatun Lake, an artificial freshwater Lake 26 meters (85 ft) above sea level.



Gulf of Mexico

The Gulf of Mexico is an ocean basin and a marginal sea of the Atlantic Ocean, mostly surrounded by the North American continent. It is bounded on the Northeast, north and northwest by the Gulf of the United States.
